
#### Our School Growth Chart: This

**Dear Parents/Guardians:** This report card for the 2007-2008 school year contains important information about our school, including the details about our academic performance, teacher qualifications, learning environment, and more.

About Our School: Mapleton Elementary is located in Mt. Sterling, KY. Mapleton Elementary has met 10 out of 10 target goals and made overall AYP for No Child Left Behind, Mapleton Elementary School, in partnership with the home and community, will provide a challenging academic program within a safe, caring environment and will enable all students to become self sufficient, productive, and useful citizens. Mapleton takes pride in its belief that all students can succeed. Our school instructs primary and intermediate students. The primary consists of 24 homerooms that work as a team to ensure continuous progress. Our intermediate program consists of 10 homerooms that team teach to cover core content. The activities outlined in our Comprehensive School Improvement Plan are monitored frequently to assist in keeping our school focused on academic achievement. Mapleton Elementary is in fact, "A Great Place to Go and Grow!"

## **How Our School Ensures**

**Educational Equity:** Our educational aim is to help all students develop their intellectual and social skills in a manner that will contribute to their future success in a changing society. We are committed to fulfilling our responsibilities to each child regardless of his or her race, gender, socioeconomic status, religion, or disability. Mapleton is determined to address any barriers that may interfere in the success of a child's education. We have established a Great Leaps Reading program and a mentoring program for students through Big Brothers/ Big Sisters of the Bluegrass.

# **How We Are Doing**

Kentucky uses the Commonwealth Accountability Testing System(CATS) to hold schools accountable for student progress. CATS has three parts: the Kentucky Core Content Tests, readiness tests by grade level, and other measures of the school's performance, including attendance, retention and dropout rates. Together these three elements make up a school's CATS Performance Score for every two-year period. The goal is that by 2014 nearly all students will score proficient or distinguished.

#### Kentucky Core Content Tests:

Kentucky's tests rate student performance as either Novice, Apprentice, Proficient, or Distinguished. These categories translate into a scale of 0-140, with 100 being considered proficient. This chart compares our school's performance with the schools in our district and throughout Kentucky. #### Procedures in Place In Our School for Drug and Weapons Detection:

Mapleton ensures the safety of our students by having all doors locked throughout the school day. All visitors must enter through the front door after being "buzzed in" by the receptionist, which leads directly into the office complex where they must sign in at the front desk. They are given a Visitor's Pass which is clearly visible to everyone in the building. Video surveillance is also in place. Our students participate in a variety of violence, drug, alcohol, and weapons awareness programs that enable them to report any situation that may pose a threat to students or someone else. It is our goal to ensure that ALL students have a safe, drug, and weapon free environment that is conducive to learning.

How We Use Technology to Teach: Technology is an integral part of the delivery of instruction in the classroom at Mapleton. Mapleton currently has two "Intelligent Classrooms." We are in the process of equipping eleven other classrooms with the technology required to be "Intelligent Classrooms." Teachers implement Accelerated Reader, Grammar and Math daily. Many students work with Orchard and Headsprout Software. Teachers and students have access to the Internet and each classroom television has a scan converter for classroom instruction. Our school has a web site that is updated on a regular basis.

### Other Important Information About Our School

**State Contest Results:** Mapleton's Academic team won both the district and regional championships during the 2006-2007 school year. Students compete in February and March at the Governor's Cup District and Regional Competition. Our Future Problem Solving Team also competes in the KY Junior Future Problem Solving Competition.

**Extracurricular Activities:** Mapleton was awarded a 21st Century Grant that allows for many after school activities. This program offers both academic and enrichment activities four days per week. Student Technology Leadership programs guide students to focus on developing advance technology skills. Mapleton has a Junior Beta Club, a Big Brothers/Sisters Mentoring Program and Conservation with a state Conservation Officer.

**Awards & Recognitions:** Mapleton is a member of the Kentucky Association of School Councils and accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Mapleton has been recognized as a 'Gold School' in technology excellence. Mapleton Elementary is home to three National Board Certified Teachers, one of which was a finalist for Kentucky Teacher of the Year.

What We Are Doing To Improve: We offer the following to improve our school and instruction: Early Success/Soar to Success Reading Intervention Programs, Great Leaps, Literacy Block in Primary, History Alive, ESS and 21st Century After School Programs, Everyday Math, Accelerated Reading, Accelerated Math, Orchard Software programs, Spanish for fourth and fifth grade students, Junior Great Books, Gifted Services, School At-Risk Team Leaders, and a Mentoring Program.
