Mapleton Elementary's campus is located in Mount Sterling, which is in Montgomery County. Mapleton Elementary is committed to continuous improvement in teaching that results in learning for all students. It is our goal to work cooperatively with all stakeholders – parents, students, teachers, and community members to address our top priority; our students. The configuration of our school has changed from a K-4 school to a Pre K – 5 school for the 2018-2019 school year. Mapleton's current enrollment is 492 students. We have 31 Pre-K, 63 Kindergarten, 67 first grade, 76 second grade, 81 third grade, 91 fourth grade, and 83 fifth grade. We are currently as school-wide Title 1 school. Our current Free/reduced lunch percentage is 76.6%, and our minority percentage is 9.6%. Mapleton's staff consists of 3.5 special education teachers, 23 classroom teachers, 1.5 speech pathologists, 1 music teacher, 1 PE teacher, 1 art teacher, 1 media specialist, 1 counselor, 1 Assistant Principal, and 1 Principal. We also have the Read to Achieve Grant, which employs one teacher to work with K-3 reading students. Our classified staff consists of: 1 secretary, 1 attendance clerk, 3 kindergarten assistants, 3.5 special education assistants, 4 FMD assistants, 1 school nurse, 1 general assistant, .5 library assistant, 1 FRYSC director, 1 cafeteria manager, 4 cafeteria workers, 2 lunchroom monitors, and 3 custodians. We also have school-based Pathways services. Mt. Sterling is the county seat to Montgomery County, which is home to 26,500 residents. It is the economic engine for this Central Kentucky region as noted by Site Selection magazine, recently placing the community as a top ten Micropolitan community in Kentucky. This is due to the growth and capital investment made in the community. Montgomery County is home to 34 industries employing over 5,000 area residents and three are currently expanding their operations. A new state of the art 65 bed hospital just opened, a regional arts center, the Clay Community Center, which is home to the newest and fastest growing extended campus for Morehead State University, a new technical/community college is opened in March, 2013, plus numerous other amenities.

Mapleton Elementary is committed to continuous improvement in teaching that results in learning for all students. Our commitment is evident in our School Improvement Plan with an emphasis on effective means for impacting learning through appropriate change and support to assist our school and students in reaching proficiency and beyond. Our mission statement is: Mapleton Elementary, in partnership with the home and community, will provide a challenging academic program with a safe, caring environment and will enable all students to become self-sufficient, reliable, and productive members of society. The shared vision of Mapleton Elementary school, staff, students, parents, and community is to lead all of Kentucky's children to be Top 10 in everything we do! It is our goal to ensure that all students reach their highest level of academic

performance and develop their creativity, independent thinking, physical well-being, and social skills. At Mapleton Elementary, we believe the following: All students can reach their full potential through effective teaching. All curricula must be engaging, challenging, and differentiated to meet the needs of all students. Individuals learn best when actively engaged in the learning process. We must work together toward our common purpose. Learning is a lifelong pursuit. We must provide our students with a safe environment that encourages the development of healthy relationships and a positive self- concept. Education is the shared responsibility of the student, home and family, school, and the entire community. To ensure the success of all of our students, all teachers have high expectations for student success. In order to meet the needs of all of our students, Mapleton utilizes a variety of effective educational practices including: goal setting, RTI, Standards Based Grading, common assessments, weekly PLC meetings by grade-levels, weekly faculty meetings focused on professional development, common planning, and researched based programs. Our school has a focus on each child receiving an individualized education. Mapleton Elementary implements school-wide behavior expectations titled "The Mapleton Way." We have common expectations for the cafeteria, bathrooms, hallways, playground, and entering and exiting the building. These are taught, modeled, and practiced throughout the school year. Academic and behavior expectations are communicated in a variety of ways including: parent/teacher conferences, student conferences, parent/student handbook, agenda book, weekly communication folders, and weekly newsletters from the principal and teachers. Students are provided the opportunity to participate in a variety of activities that promote leadership, responsible citizenship, academic success, and student's special interests. Activities offered at Mapleton include: STEM Club, Academic Team, STLP, and Too Good for Drugs. We have 4 active student leadership groups: Citizenship, Safety, Environmental Improvement, and Technology. Each month, we recognize a student of the month from each homeroom. The students are selected based on citizenship, effort, and behavior. We also have an extremely active Parent Teacher Organization. They provide numerous volunteer hours as well as monetary support to enhance our school's mission. They also plan and coordinate numerous family involvement activities to bring our school and families together such as fall festival, Valentine dance, ...

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Notable Achievements and Areas of Improvement

Mapleton Elementary has been named a School of Distinction/High Progress School. Our state classification is Distinguished and Progressing. Our improvement score indicates that we are in the top 10% of improvement in the state. Our school met its Annual Measurable Objective (AMO) set by the state in 2015-16 school year. Scores from last year are in a state transition phase. We are ranked 44th out of Kentucky's 712 elementary schools. Our recent test scores are just one indicator of Mapleton's tradition of excellence. Many of our students place in numerous types of competitions including several students placing in the conservation poster contest. We have a very active Student Technology Leadership Club that submits projects in a regional competition and has moved to state level. We also have an active elementary Academic Team that successfully competes with Quick Recall and Future Problem Solving. The Academic Team has won the district elementary overall title for the last two years. We have a very active student leadership teams that focus on the areas of (Civics, Environmental Improvement, Safety, and Technology). Our number one area of improvement that we are striving to achieve is to eliminate all novice performance in our school. We are also focusing on closing the Achievement Gap and moving apprentice students to proficient. We are constantly working to meet the individual needs of all of our students through

effective teaching strategies. Another area of focus for Mapleton Elementary is to increase parental involvement. We want to continuously strive to find ways to encourage parents to be involved in their child's education. Mapleton has also worked hard to involve community leaders and stakeholders as volunteers in our school. The Academic Team has won the district elementary overall title for the last three years.

In an effort to increase parental and community involvement, Mapleton has taken a proactive approach. We have implemented a family dinner night that includes serving dinner, a health fair, and STUDENT-Led conferences and spotlight night. We also host a spring literacy and math nights. During the literacy night, children are involved in various literacy activities and parents are able to attend different workshops to learn ways that they can help their child in school. Parents and their child will pick up their first set of books for our summer literacy program initiative. A spring family math night is also held to increase support for parents/guardians with helping their child with math at home. We also believe in the opportunity for every child to be a star on stage. Every student will participate in at least one performance per year in which the public is invited to attend. Also, we host a school-wide science fair, which involves not only our students, but numerous businesses that provided demonstrations for our students. Mapleton also hosts a school-wide Reading Fair that involves judges from the community and professional organizations. We take pride in the efforts we are making to reach out to our parents and community.
